## ATHLETICS:

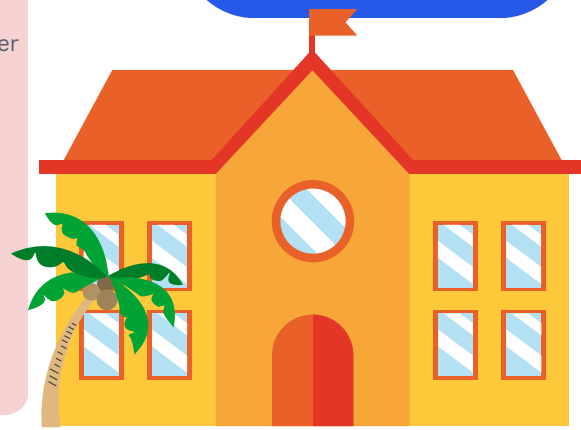
